



College attainment by socioeconomic status





Educational attainment by SES, class of 2002







What is the impact of selection into the Dell Scholars Program on college access, persistence and bachelor's degree completion within four or six years?


Summary of impacts: Enrollment, persistence & degree attainment

Outcome	Overall	Less-selective institutions	More-selective institutions
Immediate enrollment	3%		
2 nd year persistence	5%	6%	3%
3 rd year persistence	11%	15%	7%
BA attainment, in 4 years	22%	52%	14%
BA attainment, in 6 years (2009-2010 only)	20%	32%	13%



Federal loan borrowing, year 1




Parent PLUS loan borrowing, year 1




Private loan borrowing, year 1




Working 30+ hours / week, year 1




Credit attainment




Cumulative GPA

Key program features

- Long-term, personal commitment:
 - Program supports students to & through college with very stable staff
 - Data-informed system through which staff identify and respond to risk for not persisting
 - Flexible, student-focused policies & practices (e.g., flexibility in fund disbursement)
- Multifaceted: suite of supports to address the financial, academic, social and life challenges students can face in college
- Carrot & stick: Scholarship aid combined with reporting requirements



Implications

- Improving college success among low-income, first-generation college goers is an important national policy challenge
- Many efforts to improve access and/or success focus on only one dimension of difficulty students face
- The Dell Scholars Program, which combines generous financial aid with strategic outreach and support using technology and a large student-to-staff ratio, presents a promising, scalable model to better identify and respond to the risk factors students exhibit, particularly in context of less-selective institutions
